Definitions

Entries Close - means your entry form along with payment must be presented at the Secretaries office Mt Gambier A&H Society by mail, or in person.

Exhibits- means the actual item that you are entering into the competition, Exhibits are not required to be presented when entering, please check date and time for each section carefully.

Once items are staged, they cannot be removed from the bench

SHOW HALL Opening Times for public viewing

Horticulture: 9.00am to 7.00pm Friday & Saturday.

CONDITIONS for POT PLANTS: Pot Plants need to have been owned by the Exhibitor for a minimum of six (6) Calendar months prior to exhibiting. Pots must be clean.

a. Pots not to exceed 60cms unless otherwise stated

b. Plants must be DISTINCT unless otherwise stated

c. Exhibits of inferior quality not necessarily awarded a prize

d. Only the plant to be judged in the pot (no weeds or decorative under planting)

e. Pots are to be free of livestock e.g. mealy bug, aphid & snails

f. If an exhibit is staged with a contaminant it will be removed or asked to be removed

Conditions:

a. Classes Floral Design inclusive are to be arranged in all detail by the exhibitor in the hall, unassisted by an adult.

b. All entries to have name of child and school on bottom of container to aid its return.

c. Due to space limitation, children are requested to keep entries not greater than 50cm wide.

d. Exhibits can be moved at the discretion of the Head Steward.

e. Oasis support may be used but not seen.

f. Agricultural and Horticultural material are those you would find on a farm for farming purposes.

g. Exhibitors need to take care when staging their work as to not mark the bench or touch other exhibitors work.

- e.** Display is important; use medium size paper plates where there are several articles in a class e.g. Lemons or oranges use a few nice clean leaves.
- f.** Jars will be provided where necessary.
